Lisa Wilson

Lisa Wilson is a well-known radio personality and a mother of two in her third trimester. Mrs. Wilson was referred to this office as her doctor expressed concern at her reaction to pregnancy. After spending some time with Lisa, it has been found that she may be exhibiting signs of two separate personality disorders: antisocial personality disorder and histrionic personality disorder.

Diagnoses

Antisocial personality disorder meets the necessary criteria for the symptoms that Mrs. Wilson is exhibiting: significant patterns of antisocial behavior including deceit, failing to conform to social norms, and lacking any kind of remorse. Lisa also displays behavior that meets the criteria for histrionic personality disorder: flirtatious, attention-seeking, dresses in a manner to seduce, prone to dramatics, and has inauthentic emotional responses. Rationale

In one of the interviews, Mrs. Wilson shared a story from her childhood. She explained how she had betrayed her best friend by planting a kiss on her friend's crush. It was noted that Lisa was gleeful while sharing this story, showing no remorse at all, even after stating she never spoke to her friend again. This is one of the first of many examples of deceit, exploits, and betrayals that Mrs. Wilson shared. (Frazier, B.J., 2020)

Mrs. Wilson displays no regard for her family. She has admitted to often finding ways to distance herself from her children through deceit and manipulation. Often, Lisa sees them as nuisances or annoyances. Mrs. Wilson is proud of how she has her husband at her beck and call.

She has shared multiple instances of adultery throughout their entire relationship and has demeaned, abused, and manipulated her husband into accepting her lifestyle.

Throughout every interview, Mrs. Wilson made many attempts at soliciting sex. Each adulterous and sexual exploit that Lisa shared were accompanied with movements that were made to be more... inviting. Lisa's anger rose every time she was refused, and her manners would adjust with her anger.

Treatment

The best course of action would be to continue psychotherapy, specifically, cognitive behavioral therapy. (Histrionic Personality Disorder), (Mayo Foundation for Medical Education..., 2023). However, Lisa Wilson will be referred to another clinic as she insists that her sessions meet certain expectations. Failure to meet said expectations results in abusive reactions from Mrs. Wilson.
